history. For in worship and study we celebrate the 'mighty acts of God' in the midst of the turmoil of human affairs across the ages. We recall and acknowledge the gracious power of God in challenging arrogance and forgiving sin in the life of the Jewish people and, supremely, in the crucified and risen life of Jesus. The astonishing thing is that, despite the terrible evil done by human beings to others, God and themselves, history is given meaning in God's triumphant suffering love for every person.

The past events in which this purpose has been disclosed do not stay in the past. They become present in the worship, teaching and pastoral care of the Church so that our lives and the life of the world are taken up into the gracious providence of God. Because we need to be reminded of God's calling and our responsibility, I hope that you will be present for the Covenant Service at which 'we enter into or renew our covenant with God'.
